We have two recent articles published. One in <u>Waterkeeper</u> International, by Gary Wockner, that focus's on Megh Ale's history of conservation and effort to save Nepali

rivers. The article explores the fate of the Karnali River as Ultimate Descents Rafting Company leads an 8 day Save the Karnali Expedition. The participants learn about the hydropower projects and the people and cultures they pass along the way including impacts to the Raute people, Nepals last remaining nomadic tribe.
